MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE DISTRICT SEPTEMBER 27, 2019

A meeting of the Board of Directors (the "Directors" or "Board") of the Kansas City Downtown Streetcar Transportation Development District (the "District") was held on Thursday, September 27, 2019, commencing at 9:00 a.m., in the City Council Dining Room, 8th Floor, City Hall, 414 East 12th Street, Kansas City, Missouri 64106, after giving due notice.

The following Directors were present in person: Matthew Staub, Dana Gibson and Jeff Krum. Also present were Douglas Stone of Lewis Rice, LLC, Mari Ruck, Commissioner of Revenue for Kansas City, Missouri (the "City"), LaShena Graham-Hayes of the Commissioner of Revenue's office, Tammy Queen, Director of Finance for the City, Denise Goodson of Lewis Rice, LLC, Tom Gerend, Executive Director of the Kansas City Streetcar Authority, and Tuan Tran, Senior Analyst with the City Finance Department. Mr. Staub recognized that a quorum of the Board was present and called the meeting to order.

The Directors first considered Resolution 2019-4, appointing a Chairman and Executive Director for the remainder of the current office term. Mr. Stone explained the necessity for the resolution to cover the District's officer term gap until November 4, 2019 due to the City's change of mayoral administration. Mr. Krum moved to approve Resolution 2019-4. Mr. Gibson seconded the motion. A vote was held, and the Directors present unanimously adopted Resolution 2019-4.

Next, the Directors considered Resolution 2019-5, approving minutes from the Board's last meeting. Mr. Krum moved to approve Resolution 2019-5. Mr. Gibson seconded the motion. A vote was held, and the Directors present unanimously adopted Resolution 2019-5.

Then, the Directors considered Resolution 2019-6, electing a chairman, and appointing a vice-chairman, secretary, treasurer and executive director as the officers of the District in accordance with the Bylaws. Mr. Gibson moved to approve Resolution 2018-6. Mr. Krum seconded the motion. A vote was held, and the Directors present unanimously adopted Resolution 2019-6.

Next, Ms. Queen introduced Ms. Graham-Hayes, who then presented a financial update. The Board was provided copies of a revised estimate of the District's budget and of the City's Streetcar Fund Account for Fiscal Year 2020, actual results of the District's budget and of the City's Streetcar Fund Account for Fiscal Year 2019, actual results of the District's budget for Fiscal Years 2017, 2018 and 2019, a draft of the budget for the City's Street Car Fund Account for Fiscal Year 2021, and a proposed budget for the District for Fiscal Year 2021, as well as a summary of the real property and surface pay parking space assessment billings for Fiscal Years 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019, copies of which are attached to these minutes. Ms. Graham-Hayes discussed the District's finances and explained that the District's costs are fully funded from the revenue of the District. The Directors then discussed the financial projections for the District, with Mr. Gerend providing input regarding cost increases over time with the addition of new vehicles.

Then, the Directors considered Resolution 2019-7, approving an Amended and Restated Cooperative Agreement for Collection of Special Assessments with Jackson County Missouri. Mr. Stone provided an explanation of the provisions of the Amended and Restated Cooperative Agreement, with further detail provided by Ms. Ruck. Discussion ensued, upon the conclusion of which, Mr. Krum moved to approve Resolution 2019-7. Mr. Gibson seconded the motion. A vote was held, and the Directors present unanimously adopted Resolution 2019-7.

Next, the Directors considered Resolution 2019-8, setting the District's Real Property Special Assessment Rates for assessment year 2019. Mr. Gibson moved to approve Resolution 2019-8. Mr. Krum seconded the motion. A vote was held, and the Directors present unanimously adopted Resolution 2019-8.

Then, the Directors considered Resolution 2019-9, setting the District's Surface Parking Assessment Rate for assessment year 2019. Mr. Gibson moved to approve Resolution 2019-9 and Mr. Krum seconded the motion. A vote was held, and the Directors present unanimously adopted Resolution 2019-9.

Next the Directors considered Resolution 2019-10, approving an annual budget for the District with respect to the District's Fiscal Year 2020-2021. Mr. Krum moved to approve Resolution 2019-10. Mr. Gibson seconded the motion. A vote was held, and the Directors present unanimously adopted Resolution 2019-10. A copy of the annual budget for the District with respect to the District's Fiscal Year 2020-2021 is attached to Resolution 2019-10.

Then, the Directors considered Resolution 2019-11, authorizing a Letter Agreement with Kansas City, Missouri and The Kansas City Streetcar Authority, Inc. regarding Dedicated City Employee Costs. Mr. Stone provided a brief explanation of the provisions of the Letter Agreement. Mr. Gibson then moved to approve Resolution 2019-11. Mr. Krum seconded the motion. A vote was held, and the Directors present unanimously adopted Resolution 2019-11.

Mr. Staub asked if there was any other business to come before the meeting. Mr. Gerend then spoke about current operations of the streetcar, including ridership and the timing of the newest vehicle being placed in operations, and the status of the application for federal funds and the possibilities regarding a northern extension of the line. Upon the conclusion of Mr. Gerend's comments, the meeting was adjourned.

Also present were Tammy Queen, Executive Director of the District, Douglas Stone and Tom Martin of Lewis Rice, LLC, Mari Ruck, Commissioner of Revenue for Kansas City, Missouri (the "City"), LaShena Graham-Hayes of the Commissioner of Revenue's office, John Stamm, Mayor Lucas' Chief of Staff, Aly Hernandez Mayor Lucas' External Affairs Manager, and Mark Coulter, General Counsel to Port KC. A member of the public observed the meeting via remote access, but no record was retained of her name or address. Chairman Lucas recognized that a quorum of the Board was present and called the meeting to order.

The Board acknowledged that under the Missouri Transportation Development District Act, Sections 238.200, et seq., RSMO, as amended (the "TDD Act"), one seat on the Board of this particular District is to be held by the individual who is then at the time serving as the presiding officer of the Port Authority of Kansas City, Missouri ("Port KC"). The Board also acknowledged that Phil Glynn has succeeded Dana Gibson as the presiding officer of Port KC, and therefore that Mr. Glynn has replaced Dana Gibson as a Director of the District automatically and without need for action by the Board.

The Board then took up Resolution 2020-1, removing Dana Gibson as Secretary of the District and appointing Phil Glynn as Interim Secretary of the District for the remainder of the unexpired term. Mr. Staub moved to approve Resolution 2020-1, and Mr. Krum seconded the motion. A vote was held, and the Directors present unanimously adopted Resolution 2020-1.

Next, Ms. Queen introduced Ms. Graham-Hayes, who then presented a brief interim financial update pending a complete update at the Board's annual meeting in September. The Board was provided copies of a revised estimate of the District's budget and of the City's Streetcar Fund Account for Fiscal Year 2021 (ending April 30, 2021), as well as actual results for prior years, copies of which are attached to these minutes. The discussion focused on the impact of the pandemic on sales tax revenues within the District, which were (as anticipated) far below projections attributable presumably to the COVID-19 pandemic. Ms. Queen and Ms. Ruck reminded the Board that there were very substantial reserves and it is anticipated that there are

sufficient funds in reserves to cover presently anticipated shortfalls from current revenue. Ms. Queen advised that a full report would be provided at the annual meeting in September.

The Board turned to the next item on the Agenda, a discussion regarding a lawsuit in which the District is named as a party, specifically Commerce Tower Place, LLC vs. Jackson County Board of Equalization, *et al.* Mr. Stone reported that he recently became aware of the lawsuit, but that the District has not yet been served. Mr. Stone advised that the lawsuit was brought by the owner of Commerce Tower Place, a recently completed mixed-use redevelopment of the former Commerce Tower office building at 9th and Main Streets. The other defendants are the Jackson County Assessor, the Jackson County Collector, the Jackson County Board of Equalization and the Downtown Community Improvement District (Downtown CID). Commerce Tower Place had been granted real property ad valorem tax abatement by the Land Clearance for Redevelopment Authority but was asserting that the abatement was not being correctly implemented. The Property Owner/Petitioner raised two main issues in the lawsuit. First, the Petitioner was objecting to the pre-redevelopment base valuation placed on the property by the County Assessor. This claim has nothing to do with the District or the Downtown CID. The second aspect of the lawsuit is an assertion that the special assessments of both the District and the Downtown CID are "improperly" using the property's market value without regard to the ad valorem property tax abatement.

At this point, Mayor Lucas was called away on other business, but a quorum remained and the meeting continued.

Mr. Glynn then made the following motion:

I move that we vote to temporarily close this meeting to the public, pursuant to our authority to do so under subsection 1 of Section 610.021 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri – which authorizes the District to close its meetings to the extent the discussion relates to any confidential or privileged communications with its attorney, and that the meeting be re-opened to the public upon the conclusion of those discussions.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Krum. A roll call vote was held, and the votes were Staub – Aye; Krum – Aye; and Glynn – Aye, whereupon the Board went into closed session at 3:33 p.m.

The Board returned to open session at 3:55 p.m., and the member of the public who had been in attendance prior to the closed session was no longer present.

It was determined that there was no public comment and no further business, whereupon the meeting was adjourned.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Reference is made to the Second Amended and Restated Streetcar Agreement dated April 27, 2017 (the "April 2017 Agreement"), as amended by Letter Agreements dated February 1, 2018, October 23, 2018 and January 21, 2020 (the "Letter Agreements", and together with the April 2017 Agreement, the "Agreement") among the City of Kansas City, Missouri (the "City"), the Kansas City Streetcar Authority (the "Authority") and the Kansas City Downtown Streetcar Transportation Development District (the "District"). Capitalized terms used but not defined in this Letter Agreement have the meaning given to such term in the Agreement.

It is acknowledged that in the Letter Agreements, the City was given the right to reimbursement out of moneys in the Initial Phase Fund for the Dedicated City Employees Costs incurred for the Dedicated City Employees with respect to the City's Fiscal Years ending April 30, 2019, April 30, 2020 and April 30, 2021, not to exceed \$200,000 per Fiscal Year, with such reimbursement holding the fifth (5th) level of priority among the prioritization of expenditures set forth in Section 7-3 of the Agreement. After consultation among us, and in furtherance of our mutual intent to preserve the full amount of the City's annual contribution to the Initial Phase Fund in the amount of \$2,039,000 (the "City Annual Contribution"), we hereby agree that:

(1) the City shall also have the right to reimbursement out of moneys in the Initial Phase Fund up to the aggregate amount of \$125,000 (in addition to the Dedicated City Employees Costs) to be used by the City for streetcar/transit support costs, including streetcar signal maintenance and the streetcar safety audit (the "Additional City Streetcar Support Costs") that are incurred by the City during the City's Fiscal Year ending April 30, 2021 and approved in advance by the Executive Director of the Authority, which approval shall not be unreasonably denied;

- (2) the City shall provide to the Authority and/or the District upon request reasonable detailed supporting documentation with respect to the Additional City Streetcar Support Costs paid from the Initial Phase Fund; and

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Reference is made to the Second Amended and Restated Streetcar Agreement dated April 27, 2017 (the "April 2017 Agreement"), as amended by Letter Agreements dated February 1, 2018, October 23, 2018, January 21, 2020 and February 10, 2020 (the "Letter Agreements", and together with the April 2017 Agreement, the "Agreement") among the City of Kansas City, Missouri (the "City"), the Kansas City Streetcar Authority (the "Authority") and the Kansas City Downtown Streetcar Transportation Development District (the "District"). Capitalized terms used but not defined in this Letter Agreement have the meaning given to such term in the Agreement.

It is acknowledged that in the Letter Agreements, the City was given the right to reimbursement out of moneys in the Initial Phase Fund for (1) Dedicated City Employees Costs incurred for the Dedicated City Employees with respect to the City's Fiscal Years ending April 30, 2019, April 30, 2020 and April 30, 2021, not to exceed \$200,000 per Fiscal Year, and (2) Additional City Streetcar Support Costs (up to the aggregate amount of \$125,000) incurred by the City during the City's Fiscal Year ending April 30, 2021, with such reimbursement holding the fifth (5th) level of priority among the prioritization of expenditures set forth in Section 7-3 of the Agreement. After consultation among us, and in furtherance of our mutual intent to preserve the full amount of the City's annual contribution to the Initial Phase Fund in the amount of \$2,039,000 (the "City Annual Contribution"), we hereby agree that the City shall also have the right to reimbursement out of moneys in the Initial Phase Fund, with such reimbursement holding the fifth (5th) level of priority among the prioritization of expenditures set forth in Section 7-3 of the Agreement:

- (1) for the Dedicated City Employees Costs incurred for the Dedicated City Employees with respect to the City's Fiscal Year ending April 30, 2022, not to exceed \$250,000 for such Fiscal Year; and
- (2) for the Additional City Streetcar Support Costs, up to the aggregate amount of \$75,000 (in addition to the Dedicated City Employees Costs) incurred by the City during the City's Fiscal Year ending April 30, 2022 and approved in advance by the Executive Director of the Authority, which approval shall not be unreasonably denied.

The City shall provide to the Authority and/or the District upon request reasonable detailed supporting documentation with respect to the Additional City Streetcar Support Costs paid from the Initial Phase Fund during the City's Fiscal Year ending April 30, 2022. Amounts paid pursuant to contract or lease by private non-governmental entities leasing real property from the City or any agency, board, commission or other instrumentality whose members are appointed by the City's Mayor or City Council, which amounts are pursuant to such contract or lease intended for the financial benefit or support of the Project, shall not reduce the amount of the City's Annual Contribution.

Capitalized terms used but not defined in this Letter Agreement have the meaning given to such term in the Agreement.

RESOLUTION OF KANSAS CITY DOWNTOWN STREETCAR TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT SETTING REAL PROPERTY SPECIAL ASSESSMENT RATES FOR ASSESSMENT YEAR 2020.

WHEREAS, Kansas City Downtown Streetcar Transportation Development District (the "**District**") was established by Order of the Jackson County Circuit Court on August 2, 2012;

WHEREAS, the District's Board of Directors (the "Board"), pursuant to Section 238.230, RSMo, and the Board's Resolution 2012-12 (the "Assessment Resolution") submitted a proposal to the District's qualified voters for election regarding whether to approve certain special assessments (as more particularly defined in section 2(a) of the Assessment Resolution, the "Real Property Assessments") to help finance the design, construction, ownership and/or operation of a downtown fixed rail streetcar line, and all elements thereof, including without limitation a maintenance facility, operating with the boundaries of, or serving and benefiting, the District (the "Project");

WHEREAS, the qualified voters approved the imposition of the Real Property Assessments, with certain maximum rates, and with actual rates from time to time to be set annually by the Board for each Assessment Year;

WHEREAS, the Board desires to set the actual rates for the Real Property Assessments with respect to the Assessment Year commencing on January 1, 2020 (the "2020 Assessment Year");

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Second Amended and Restated Streetcar Agreement dated April 27, 2017 among the City of Kansas City, Missouri (the "City"), the Kansas City Streetcar Authority, Inc. (the "Authority") and the District, as amended (the "Agreement"), the Executive Director of the District and the Chair of the Authority have consulted with respect to the application of "surplus" funds remaining as of the end of the District's preceding fiscal year as required by Section 7-6 of the Agreement;

WHEREAS, the Authority has advised the District that it has waived any requirement, with respect to the 2020 Assessment Year only, that the District use surplus funds to reduce Real Property Assessment rates for the 2020 Assessment Year; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director of the District has produced a roll of the real property upon which such special assessments shall be levied.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kansas City Downtown Streetcar Transportation Development District, as follows:

1. Capitalized terms used but not defined in this Resolution have the same meanings respectively given to such terms in the Assessment Resolution.

- 2. The Real Property Assessments are hereby imposed with respect to the 2020 Assessment Year, in the following amounts:
 - (a) **Residential Property:** With respect to Residential Property (unless subject on January 1, 2020 to an Exemption, in which event the provisions of subsection (d) below shall apply), the Real Property Assessment is imposed in an annual amount equal to the sum obtained by multiplying the Residential Assessable Value of such Residential Property by Seventy Cents (\$0.70).
 - (b) *Non-Residential Property*: With respect to Non-Residential Property (unless subject on January 1, 2020 to an Exemption, in which event the provisions of subsection (d) below shall apply), the Real Property Assessment is imposed in an annual amount equal to the sum obtained by multiplying the Commercial Assessable Value of such Non-Residential Property by Forty-Eight Cents (\$0.48).
 - (c) *City Property*: Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (a) and (b) above, with respect to City Property, the Real Property Assessment is imposed in an annual amount equal to the sum obtained by multiplying the City Assessable Value of such City Property by One and 04/100 Dollars (\$1.04), which the City has agreed, subject to annual appropriation, to pay pursuant to the Agreement, but in all events, the City's obligation for the Real Property Assessment with respect to the 2020 Assessment Year shall not exceed Two Million Thirty-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$2,039,000) as provided by the Agreement.
 - (d) *Tax Exempt Property*: With respect to Tax Exempt Property, the Real Property Assessment is imposed in an annual amount equal to the sum obtained by multiplying the Tax Exempt Assessable Value of such Tax Exempt Property by Forty Cents (\$0.40).
- 3. The Board hereby approves the Special Assessment Roll attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
- 4. The Executive Director of the District, with such assistance from the District's General Counsel and other parties as the Executive Director determines, is hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary and appropriate in order to cause the Real Property Assessments to be billed and collected, subject to implementing any adjustments in valuation by the Assessor of Jackson County, Missouri, all in accordance with the Missouri Transportation Development District Act, Sections 238.200, et seq., RSMo, as amended, and other applicable law.
- 5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, the Executive Director of the District has produced a roll of the Surface Pay Parking Lots upon which the Surface Parking Assessments shall be levied.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kansas City Downtown Streetcar Transportation Development District, as follows:

- 1. Capitalized terms used but not defined in this Resolution have the same meanings respectively given to such terms in the Assessment Resolution.
- 2. The Surface Parking Assessments are hereby imposed with respect to the Assessment Year commencing January 1, 2020, upon real property within the District used as a Surface Pay Parking Lot during the Assessment Year commencing January 1, 2020, in an annual amount equal to the sum of Fifty-Four and 75/100 Dollars (\$54.75) multiplied by the number of Pay Parking Spaces located on each such Surface Pay Parking Lot during such Assessment Year. A Surface Pay Parking Lot shall be exempt from the Surface Parking Assessment if it is in, under or otherwise a part of a multi-story structure, or if it shares common or affiliated ownership with and primarily exists to serve the employees or patrons of a business enterprise or place of interest such as (by way of example and not as a limitation) a museum, train station, or theater, which business enterprise or place of interest is located on the same or a neighboring property as the parking area under consideration.

- 3. The Board hereby approves the Surface Parking Assessment Roll attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
- 4. The Executive Director of the District, with such assistance from the District's General Counsel and other parties as the Executive Director determines, is hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary and appropriate in order to cause the Surface Parking Assessments to be billed and collected, subject to implementing any adjustments in valuation by the Assessor of Jackson County, Missouri, all in accordance with the Missouri Transportation Development District Act, Sections 238.200, et seq., RSMo, as amended, and other applicable law.
