COVID-19 REACTIVATION PHASING PLAN

INITIATION OF PHASE II

v1.3 – 04.30.2021

Phase II of the KC Streetcar COVID-19 is active as of April 30, 2021, to support growing downtown activity levels, ridership demand, related operating schedule refinements, and updated local guidance from the City of Kansas City, Missouri on COVID-19 regulations. The practices, policies, and schedule outlined in Phase II are intended to be continuous and long-term, pending future changes from healthcare professionals or local authorities.

Effective Date: April 30, 2021

Continuation of Mitigations:

- Retain COVID-19 instituted streetcar and facility cleaning procedures, including supplemental streetcar cleaning as needed.
- Retain on-board hand sanitizer dispensers.
- Retain enforcement on limiting “continuous riding”.
- Retain PPE availability for operations and maintenance personal, including masks and gloves.
- Retain equipping staff with sanitization equipment including wipes, spray, and hand sanitizer.
- Continue public messaging in a manner consistent with local government, KCMO health department directives and best practices, and regional transit partners.
- Retain on-board passenger Mask Requirements (federal requirement).
- Retain mask availability for riders who do not have them (as long as federal mask requirements are in place).
- Vehicle Maintenance Facility:
 - Retain mask requirements within common areas (entrances, hallways, break rooms, restrooms).
 - Retain mask requirements in meeting room/offices when social distancing cannot be achieved.
 - Retain package delivery protocol.
 - Retain guest sign-in protocol (with exception of temperature checks).
 - Retain internal signage related to applicable mitigations that remain in place.
 - Retain restriction on internal VMF tours (w/ exceptions granted by ED approval).
 - Retain temperature checks for all guests and those not vaccinated.

Discontinued Mitigations:

- Social distancing requirements.
- Signage limiting seat availability on-board streetcars.

- Auto open-door policy.
- On-board and on-shelter signage specific to social distancing requirements.
- Singleton Yard Vehicle Maintenance Facility meeting restrictions (mitigations above apply).
- Temperature checks for vaccinated employees (unless required by direct employer).

Phase II Operating Schedule Change - Effective May 24, 2021:

Monday-Thursday: 6:00 am to 10:00 pm, 3 cars
Friday: 6:00 am to 12:00 am, 3 cars
Saturday: 7:00 am to 12:00 am, 3 cars
Sunday: 7:00 am to 10:00 pm, 3 cars

Schedule adjustments may be made during Phase II in response to observed demand and downtown activity levels.

Under all conditions, ongoing monitoring of public health related guidance and directives will continue. In the event of a resurgence or a tightening of local guidance, a return to all or a subset of originally deployed mitigations and reduced schedule will be considered.
